## **Incumbents Sweep Board Election**

After a spirited campaign with 10 candidates vying for 4 seats, the victors were all incumbents: Richard Ng, Jeff Gurnari, Howard Pearl, and Charles Kolber. The field included two former Board members — Art Elmers and Larry Seltzer — in addition to four first-time candidates — Feroz Ali, Tom Panagiotatas, Gigi Sabarese, and George Wagner. Thanks go to all the candidates who dedicated so much time and effort to the election process.

At an open board meeting on June 13, the Board members elected their officers.

Richard Ng was selected for another term as Board President. The First Vice-President is Steve Austin and the Second VP is Tony Adamo. Howard Pearl is the Board Secretary and Charles Kolber is the Treasurer.

The number of shares voted for each candidate is shown in the accompanying chart. In accordance with Horizon House bylaws, the top three vote-getters will have a term of two years while the forth place winner, Mr. Kolber, receives a one-year term. The final vote tally is below:

## Fort Lee Volunteer Ambulance Corps Always at the Ready



Centrally located on the corner of Main Street and Anderson Avenue, sits the headquarters of the Fort Lee Volunteer

Ambulance Corps. The building houses three ambulances along with conference rooms, a kitchen, offices, sleeping and living quarters, storage rooms and a training area.

The Ambulance Corps provides emergency medical services and responds to 911 calls in 5 minutes (on average) from the time of dispatch. Factors that affect response time are availability of ambulances, call volume, roadwork, traffic conditions, the urgency of the call and weather.

Fort Lee ambulances are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

#### FROM THE BOARD

Dear Shareholders and Residents:

The Horizon House Board is grateful that it remains intact after the election results displayed a clear appreciation for the Board's accomplishments in 2018 and 2019. We are not resting on our laurels however. We are taking this opportunity to move forward in a positive way with new programs and upgrades.

In May 2019, the Horizon House Board hired a new Operations Manager, Frank Neglia, who brings excellent credentials and a vast amount of experience to our staff. At the direction of the Board, Frank has developed a revised set of job descriptions for our doormen, porters, and security staff in an effort to improve the level of service to our shareholders.

- (1) Recent/current major capital improvement projects at Horizon House include:
- Façade repairs in Buildings #1 through #4
- Riser replacement in Buildings #5 and #6
- Garage repairs in Buildings #5 and #6 are moving forward

The riser project has proceeded particularly well, with the riser replacement in Building #5 expected to be complete later this year. Please note the spectacular new circular driveway that has just been completed in front of Building #5.

- (2) The Board has engaged a contractor to have the exterior windows washed in all six buildings starting in late July. To determine the order or work, we drew numbers from a hat to prevent any preferential treatment. Building #3 was the big winner and will be washed first.
- (3) We are currently negotiating a contract to have a charging station installed between Buildings #2 and #5 for residents who already have electric cars or might purchase electric cars. Users will be charged a fee for each charge.
- (4) We have purchased a beautiful new 75", 4K TV for the Community Room. Additionally, the Board has had the Community Room newly repainted for our residents.

#### **More Ways to Get Around**

New Jersey Transit provides a service similar to New York City's Access-A-Ride that provides public transportation for residents with limited mobility who need to ride in special ADA-certified vehicles. The fare is the same as what you would pay if you took a regular NJ transit bus and pickups are made in front of Horizon House buildings. #### **Barrymore Theatre Construction on Pace**

Construction on the new Barrymore Film Center is well underway. Located on the corner of Main Street and Park Avenue (where Palisade Avenue gets a name change to Park), Barrymore will house a 250-seat cinema as well as a film museum and archive.

#### **More Construction on Main Street**

A multi-family apartment building, which will include retail on the ground floor, is going up on Main St opposite the old Metropolitan Plant Exchange location at the corner of Fletcher Avenue.



#### Middle School Just Got Bigger

Lewis F. Cole Middle School has been expanded with a brand new four-story wing — built with the purpose of alleviating overcrowding in Fort Lee's four elementary schools — that will serve the 5th



and 6th grades. The project was approved back in 2014 via referendum and the new wing will open in September for the start of the 2019-20 school year.

The new building is completely separate from the 7th and 8th grade wing and has its own security guards. The new 92,000 sq ft space has 34 classrooms, music rooms, labs, a gym, cafeteria, and a media center — all just for 5th and 6th graders. All grade 5 and 6 teachers from the four elementary schools will be moved to this new middle school setting.

#### **New Places to Eat Around Town**

New restaurants are popping up all over. A Cuban-Asian fusion restaurant has opened on Hudson Terrace, just north of the George Washington Bridge. It's called Kuba and the menu includes Cuban and American items with an Asian flair. It's at 2139 Hudson Terrace. Ample parking is available in the rear parking lot; outdoor seating is set up on Hudson Terrace. Also near the GWB, on Bridge Plaza North, is Noches de Plaza, a Mexican-Colombian fusion restaurant. Tables in front overlook the GWB toll plazas. It's at 177 Bridge Plaza North. Free valet parking available daily after 5:30 pm (call ahead to reserve). Call 201-849-7000 for more information.

## The Fruits of Summer — Pick Your Own

Peach picking season is already in gear at Demarest Farms in Hillsdale, NJ — a 20-minute drive from Horizon House. Orchards



are open weekends from 10 am to 3 pm. Admission is \$5 per person (2 and older) and includes parking, hay wagon ride, and the petting zoo. Peaches are \$10 per

bag (approx 10 lbs). Call 201-666-0472 for more information or visit demarestfarms.com.

Go a little further out, about an hour's drive, and you can pick both peaches and

blueberries at Alstede Farms in Chester, NJ. Admission is \$6.99 weekdays and \$8.99 weekends and holidays. Includes tractor drawn wagon rides, access to mazes, and live entertainment on weekends (when available). Additional children's activities for kids under 12 include pony rides, moon bounce, and corn kingdom: \$16.99 weekdays and \$19.99 weekends and holidays. ## A Walk in the Park

#### **Overpeck Park**

Drive just a short distance west on Main Street to the entrances to Overpeck Park in Leonia, a county facility which extends north and south on either side of Fort Lee Road into other neighboring communities.

This 805 acre, multi-activity area, which formerly consisted mainly of brownfields and landfills, has been transformed into a free wonderland for children and adults.

Enter on the right (north) and you will find a jogging and biking path, 6 tennis courts, and baseball and soccer fields.

A left turn off Fort Lee Road brings you to the Equestrian Center, with paddocks rented to horse owners and horses available for riding. Children especially love the miniature horses. Visitors are welcome and there are viewing areas to see the horses, both indoors and out. Picnic tables are available here and

at other locations throughout the park but no cooking is permitted.

Further along the walking path bordering Overpeck Creek, kayaks — single or double — can be rented for \$15 per paddler for two hours. Stand up paddle boards are also available at the rate of \$25 for two hours. Monday through Friday 10 am - 6 pm, weekends 9 am - 7 pm.

Continue your walk or drive through the park to discover a dog run, kite field, 3000-seat amphitheater, World Trade Center memorial, and extensive athletic fields for baseball and other sports. There's also a huge children's playground — a delight to kids from toddlers to pre-teens. A pleasant shaded seating area is provided.

Overpeck Park is open from 7 am to 10 pm. Free ample parking is available, as are restrooms. For more detailed information, call 201-336-7275.

#### **Veterans Field**

Go down River Road to Edgewater and find this nearby park, which has a gigantic American Flag easily visible from most eastern side balconies of Horizon House. The cool, breezy area has a magnificent view of the George Washington Bridge and



Hudson River. The park has sports fields, outdoor exercise machines, a popular spray park for kids with nearby playground slides and swings, a sheltered picnic area with public restrooms, trails with plenty of benches and ample parking. Veterans Field Park can be accessed by driving south on River Road from Fort Lee, or by going down Route 5 and turning left onto River Road.

## I Respectfully Disagree

What a world it would be if we all agreed on absolutely everything. But, as you know, that's just not reality. So many of us are so polarized that we sometimes find it difficult just to be near someone who isn't agreeing with us politically, and families and friendships have suffered.

A PEW Research report shows that while political conversations highlight differences, most think it's still possible to agree on nonpolitical topics. Identical shares of Republicans and Democrats (59% each) say that when people hold different views on politics, this doesn't say a lot about how much they'll agree about other topics.

So, tap into your lightheartedness, smile and find one of a myriad of topics to talk about: how about those Mets, Yankees or \_\_\_\_\_ (fill in the blank); that woman's soccer team,

our kids and grandkids, the US Open, vacations, jobs, books, theater, music, volunteer work, family or friends... the weather!

But, let's face it; we all have our own thoughts, opinions, and values — which means disagreements can be pretty common.

However, there's a big difference between just disagreeing and disagreeing respectfully. The first will likely cause hurt feelings and only add fuel to an already tense fire. The second approach can lead to new ideas and a much more productive discussion.

Unfortunately, it's all too easy to get so wrapped up in our own beliefs that all common courtesy goes straight out the window. So, as a friendly reminder, here are

some tips for disagreeing with someone, respectfully, of course.

**Don't Get Personal** — it's something you want to avoid at all costs when disagreeing with someone. Instead, focus on saying why you feel the way you do.

Recognize the Good — rarely is a suggestion so bad that you can't find a single nugget of wisdom hidden in there somewhere. Say something like, "I definitely think you're on the right track in saying that we need to (blank) but, what if we did it this way instead?"

**Remember to Listen** — sometimes hard to do as you're just sitting there waiting for your

chance to respond. So, remember to actually listen to the points that are being presented.

**Know When to Move On** — That familiar catchphrase "agree to disagree" is often repeated for a reason: It can be a handy sentiment to lean on when you need it.

Perhaps one of the most important pieces of respectfully disagreeing with someone is knowing when you need to just call it quits and move on.

No, it's not always easy to swallow your pride and walk away — particularly when you feel strongly about your side. But, sometimes it's the best thing you can do.

Homework: talk to someone you usually disagree with and find a common topic you can agree on, or if not, disagree respectfully!

## **Apartment Upkeep: Keep the Moths at Bay**

A version of this article appeared in a previous edition of HorizoNews, but many people have requested this information in the ensuing months, so we are reprinting the key points.

Clothing moths are tiny little critters that usually come out of hiding in the early evening. They are very small and fast. The adult moths lay eggs on wool clothing and blankets, so when the larvae hatch they have a readily available food source. A two-pronged attack on these bugs is recommended:



- 1. Use moth traps like the ones shown here by Safer (photo left). These have a small scented chip which attracts the adults to the trap. They last for approximately three months. When you no longer catch any critters, you know you are in the clear!
- 2. Use a neem oil solution (photo right) this is a natural non-toxic oil that gets into the bugs' reproductive systems and prevents them from laying eggs. The bugs like to lay their eggs in dark places. Make sure to spray the neem oil solution inside closets, under beds and furniture, in suitcases, and on the vents and doorways to your apartment. There is little to no odor.

This is the recipe for the neem oil solution:

- 1 Tablespoon Neem Oil
- 1 Teaspoon Liquid Soap like Ivory NOT ANTIBACTERIAL
- 1 Quart Warm Water

Mix together in a spray bottle. You may need to apply the neem oil weekly for several weeks to eradicate the issue.

If a Fort Lee ambulance is unavailable, there is a standing mutual aid agreement with surrounding jurisdictions and an ambulance from one of the following will answer your call: Cliffside Park, Edgewater, Englewood Hospital and Medical Center, Holy Name Medical Center, or another agency.

The Ambulance Corps does not provide nonemergency medical transportation.

Members of the Fort Lee Volunteer Ambulance Corps staff the ambulances from 7 pm to 6 am on weekdays and all day on weekends and national holidays. Emergency Medical Technicians who are employed by the Borough of Fort Lee staff the ambulances from 6 am to 7 pm on weekdays.

The Ambulance Corps is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and relies on donations to purchase new equipment and supplies to better serve the community. Fund drive mailings are sent out to residents annually.

They also accept donations of gently used canes, walkers, and wheelchairs that are in good working condition, and loan them out to residents who need them.
